1. Tuition Assistance

Tuition Assistance is need-based financial aid available to degree-seeking full-time students who are citizens of the RA and those individuals defined in Chapter 1, Article 6, Clause 3 of the Republic of Armenia Law on Higher and Postgraduate Professional Education.

Tuition Assistance is provided in accordance with students' documented financial need. Tuition Assistance does not have to be repaid and typically ranges from 25% to 90% of the total tuition.

Students must apply for Tuition Assistance each academic year.

Information provided by applicants is confidential, and is subject to spot checks by financial aid officers. Decisions on allocation of aid are made anonymously by the Financial Aid Committee. Submitting incomplete or false information will result in denial or revocation of any tuition assistance, and exclusion from future Tuition Assistance.

Tuition Assistance awards are made for one academic year. To be eligible for Tuition Assistance, students must be enrolled full-time and maintain good academic standing (See Grade Policies). If students switch to part-time status, Tuition Assistance will be withdrawn. If students fall below good academic standing, tuition assistance will be withdrawn, but reinstated upon regaining good academic standing.

2. Academic Scholarships

Academic scholarships are annual merit-based financial awards. A limited number of academic scholarships are available to citizens of Armenia and international students as noted below.

A student's financial situation is not considered for academic scholarships. Academic standing is the primary selection criterion for academic scholarships. However academic scholarships may also be in recognition of a combination of merit, special talent, skill, or ability.

2.1. AUA academic scholarships

AUA offers academic scholarship to current full-time students. This scholarship covers half the cost of annual tuition.

2.2. AUA/MoESCS Scholarships

AUA/MoESCS scholarships are merit-based full scholarships jointly covered by the AUA and the Ministry of Education, Science, Culture and Sport (MoESCS) of Armenia. These awards are made for one academic year.

2.3. Scholarships for International Students

International Scholarships are merit-based awards which cover up to 50% of tuition for international students.

3. Payment Options

Typically, AUA students pay tuition in equally disbursed installments as indicated in their educational contract. See Financial Aid Procedures.

3.1. Deferred Payment

Deferred Payment is an alternative payment plan included and described in the students' educational contract which allows students to temporarily suspend part of their tuition payments for a specified period of time, as described in an amendment to their main educational contract.

3.2. Work-Study within Tuition Support Program

Work-study within Tuition Support Program is a student employment program, available to full-time, degree-seeking students in good academic standing.

4. Financial Difficulties

In rare exceptional cases, students may be able to submit an application for financial aid after the deadline.
